Easter Peace



There is great irony in a city whose name is Jerusalem, 'city of peace', having suffered the violence of war and conflict for centuries. Today Jerusalem is a divided city, torn apart by waring factions, each claiming the city as their city. Over the years many have tried, and tried very hard, to make peace for Jerusalem, and for the surrounding lands. At best a wary pause in the conflict before peace is abandoned once more.

Easter is when the Prince of Peace came to the city of peace and made peace.

Jesus, born in an occupied territory, in a conquered nation, lived all his earthly days under the shadow of violence and war. He knew, far better than we do in our quiet Edinburgh streets, the fear of war. The prophets foretold him, naming him the Prince of Peace. Jesus made peace by submitting himself to violence and death.

The cross is a symbol of the most cruel and oppressive death. Reserved for those whose death was to serve as a terrifying example of Imperial power, even the word was shunned. A death which must not be named. And it is here, with wide–open arms that the Prince of Peace takes upon himself the full account of violence and hatred, not just of his era, but of all times. Jesus took it all. Jesus bore it all. Jesus made an end to it all.

Some years later, reflecting upon the peace-making victory of the cross, a man called Paul wrote, "Jesus himself is our peace, he has made us both one and broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility" (Ephesians 2:14). Jesus made peace by breaking, tearing down the walls which divide us from one another, which divide us from our Father God. In a great reversal, where all the violence of all the ages fell upon him on the cross, from him and his sacrificial death flowed out all the peace we need to live renewed and restored lives.

The only peace we will know in our lives is that peace which has been made for us on the cross of Christ. The only peace that will endure and flourish between nations and peoples is that peace which has been made for us on the cross of Christ. The peace of Easter is a peace made on the cross. **This year Jesus calls you to his cross. Jesus** welcomes you to the shadow of peace and a new life of hope in his cross. All are called, all are welcome, you can come to the sacrificed Prince of Peace and know the blessing of his peace in your life.

We are delighted to have been awarded an **Eco-**Congregation Scotland Bronze Award.

Greenpeace and Tearfund are amongst the environmental organisations asking for our support in this important survey of the amount of plastic we have to deal with on a daily basis.

It's very easy to sign up via www.thebigplasticcount.com

Print off a survey sheet and stick it to your fridge. During **11-17 March** (or any other 7 day period before 31st March) simply record the plastic you

have had to deal with each day. There are clear instructions on what to do. This is NOT about how much you can manage to recycle. It is a count of how much plastic we are all faced with every day. Once all the results have been submitted at the end of March this will provide evidence to put pressure on the UK Government to take strong action at the upcoming Global Plastic Treaty talks, hopefully striving for the sorts of measures we need to end the age of plastic.

Edinburgh. It is recognised as one of Scotland's 6 UNESCO World Heritage Sites .Find out more from **www.newlanark.org**


